Brethren,

Once again we had another busy month. Among some of the things we did were to confer four Entered Apprentice Degrees, make a fraternal visit to Henry Lodge in Fairfax and attend the Grand Master's Official Visit to the 4th and 54th Masonic Districts on March 20th. As you might also expect, we have another busy month coming up. I have scheduled Called Communications for the month of April for a Fellowcraft Degree on the 5th, a Master Mason's Degree on the 19th and another Fellowcraft Degree on the 26th.
